For this same reason, it was never possible for Afro-Brazilian practices to dispute the field of ethical normativity of the State as religions. The second theory is from the primordial school and stresses the uniqueness and the overriding importance of ethnic identity. Although this position might be considered very marginal in the field of religious controversies in Brazil today, it still makes us face the sensitive issue of the ethical foundation of our legal system. The primordialist believes that common ethnicity and the bond that goes along with it is the basis for a nation. Instead of explaining the marginalized status of people of color in the United States with an inherent biological inferiority, he instead said that it was a failure to assimilate into American culture that held people back. So, ethnic groups are conceived as mutable rather than stable, constructed in discursive practices rather than written in the genes. The conceptual model should explain how both attributional and relational dimensions of ethnicity are relevant.
